(11-6-02). "The Cherokee County Water And Sewerage Authority announces a countywide water ban effective immediately...

Outdoor watering is not allowed until further notice, with the following ex-

ceptions:

No outside watering 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. seven days a week.

If your street address ends in an even number, you may water on even calendar days during nonrestricted hours.

> If your street address ends in an odd number, you may water on odd calendar days during non-restricted hours."

(Big Fat) Greek Spaghetti

6 lg. Chicken breasts

1 ½ c. Chicken broth

1 lg. Onion, chopped

1 lg. Bell pepper, chopped

1 stick margarine

1 lg. Can Greek olives, sliced


1 lg. Can tomatoes, chopped

1 sm. Jar mushrooms, sliced

3 tbsp. Greek seasoning

1 lb. Greek cheese (feta), crumbled

1 16 oz. Pkg. Spaghetti



- Melt margarine in large Dutch oven.
- Sauté onion and bell pepper (do not brown).
- Add tomatoes, mushrooms, seasoning, cheese and olives.
- Add chicken broth and chicken pieces.
- Cook spaghetti and add to above mixture.
- Bake uncovered in large dish at 375 degrees for 20-25 minutes.
- Freezes well.

Faulty Dip Tubes in Water Heaters

Flake Test

Put flakes in a

capful of vinegar.

Do they dissolve?

Have you been finding white (or gray) flakes in your faucet, dish-



washer and shower head filters?
Maybe you've noticed a decrease in the water flow.
That's likely caused by the clogging ef-

fect of these flakes.


The flakes could be pieces of faulty dip tubes used in many major brand water heaters manufactured from 1993 to 1996. That time frame corresponds to construction in Waverly Park.

The dip tube in a water heater directs incoming cold water to the bottom of the tank, where the water rises as it becomes warmer. Without it, your water heater would produce only lukewarm water not long after turning on the faucet.

Most water heater makers get dip tubes from the same source. A

change in the manufacturing process resulted in the faulty tubes.

A disintegrating dip tube is the likely source of those white flakes. As the tube continues to shorten, the water heater produces less hot water. In a nationwide recall, the water heater manufacturers paid to have these faulty dip tubes replaced. But there's bad news. The deadline for claims in this recall program was December 31. 2000. Any repair costs will now be out of your pocket.

Alternative to Raking Leaves

You can rake the leaves that fall on your lawn or you can stall with the hope that they will eventually blow onto your neighbor's lawn.

Here's another suggestion from a Purdue University horticulturist.

"Tree leaves can be recycled directly on the lawn.

Use your power mower or shredder/vacuum to break dry leaves up into smaller pieces. A mulching blade on the mower will speed this process, but even a standard blade will do an adequate job.

For large leaves like maple and sycamore, it may take several passes to get a finely shredded product. Once the leaves are pulverized, they will break down quickly.

A fall application of nitrogen fertilizer (about 1 pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet) will help speed decomposition of the leaves and also will benefit the grass plants."
