Motor Vehicle Restrictions

The WPHA Board of Directors reminds residents of the motor vehicle restrictions on the Common Area.

According to Board Resolution 2005-02, Rule 4 "Motor vehicles are permitted only on the paved entrance driveway and parking area. No motor vehicle is permitted in any other part of the Common Area, except those vehicles involved in authorized maintenance, repair or

construction." Motor vehicles are not permitted on the walking trail.



Additionally, Cherokee County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Nicole Ebbeskotte has confirmed to WPP that dirt bikes, go-karts and all-terrain vehicles (ATV's) may not be operated legally on public roads.

If you plan to add a structure including a fence, change the exterior of your home or lot, or the use of your lot, you

must submit plans to the Architectural Committee (AC) for approval.

Plans must include dimensions of the project, its location on the lot and materials and colors to be used. A letter explaining your plans is needed. See the Archi-

tectural Guide, available on the website, for more information.

The covenants give the AC up to 60 days to review plans; however, reviews are currently taking about two weeks

from the time the AC receives useable plans. Decisions require a majority vote of the AC. Owners should not be-

gin a project before receiving written approval from the AC.


Please give your plans to Hamp at 613 Ashley Trail or e-mail them to the address in the box.

Motorized Scooters: Are They Legal On Georgia Roads?

This article is reprinted from the Forsyth County, Georgia Sheriff's website. On September 16, Cherokee County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Nicole Ebbeskotte confirmed that the article is correct and the restrictions do apply to Cherokee County.

"The increasing popularity of motorized



scooters, both electric & gasoline powered, have prompted inquiries to our agency regarding whether or not these scooters may be

legally operated on public roads.

The answer is no.

According to Georgia law, a "motor vehicle" is defined as *every* vehicle which is self-propelled and every motor vehicle is subject to certain state equipment and registration requirements. In addition, the operator of any motor vehicle must be properly licensed (GA Code 40-5-20). There are only a few exemptions to this law, none of which apply to operators of motorized scooters.

These scooters fall into the same cate-



gory as dirt bikes, gokarts and all-terrain vehicles (ATV's), none of which may be operated legally on public

roads.

In addition, every motor vehicle which is operated on the public roads must meet certain equipment requirements, such as headlight, tail light & brake lights. They must also be equipped with a speedometer in good working

order (GA Code 40-8-8). And they must also have been registered and display a license tag.

A few states have passed laws exempting motorized scooters from certain requirements of their traffic code, but as of this date, Georgia has not. Until such exemptions are passed in Georgia, operators of motorized scooters must comply with the "Rules of the Road".

Aside from the licensing and equipment requirements, parents should be very leery about allowing their children to operate scooters on the roads. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, injuries from operating these scooters are climbing at a rapid rate. A CPSC article in 2001 describes the problem: http://www.cpsc.

Just a few years ago in Forsyth County, two young boys died tragically when their dirt bike collided with a Jeep on Majors Road. We don't want a repeat of that tragedy in the future.

It is also our understanding that some dealers of motorized scooters ask purchasers to sign a form acknowledging that they understand that these vehicles may not be legally operated on public roads and streets.

Our recommendation: We recognize that these motorized scooters provide an opportunity for children to have a

lot of fun. If you are going to purchase one, by all means purchase a proper helmet for your child

to wear while riding. Look for a helmet that has a "DOT" sticker on it, meaning that the helmet meets the U.S. Dept.



of Transportation standards for safety. In addition, make sure that your child is supervised while riding and rides only on private property and/or sidewalks in your neighborhood. Never allow them to ride on the public roads and streets of Forsyth County.

Make sure you follow the safe riding instructions that come with the scooter. These include never riding "double" or pulling a friend on a skateboard. Our officers have witnessed all of these happening. We've seen children as young as five or six years of age riding motorized scooters on the streets. We recommend that you not give in to "peer pressure" to buy a motorized scooter for your child. Just because the parents down the street bought one for their child does not make it the right (or safe) thing to do.

Finally, parents who allow their children to operate motorized scooters on public roads may be cited for allowing an unlicensed minor to operate a motor vehicle (GA Code 40-5-123)."

Cherokee County Sheriff's Office PIO Ebbeskotte added, "If there is EVER a question of how and where someone should be riding any type of motorized vehicle please call 911 and we will have someone come out and look into the situation."
