Annual Members Meeting Set For April 17

The 2008 WPHA Annual Members Meeting will be at 7:30 p.m., on Thursday, April 17, 2008, at the WP pool.

The Board of Directors set the meeting date at their February 19 meeting.

The meeting agenda will include a review of the past year, consideration of a bylaws amendment reducing check signatures to one for certain payments and election of directors for the next year.

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Pool Rehab To Proceed

The resurfacing of the WP pool will be scheduled for early May just prior to the season opening.

Drought-related water use restrictions had put the upcoming pool season in doubt.

The Cherokee County Water Authority adopted relaxed watering restrictions on February 12 that allow swimming pools to be filled.

The resurfacing project will



require that the pool be drained completely while the resurfacing material is applied.

The new surface will also require periodic "massaging" for several days before water can be added. Volunteers will be needed to perform this task.

Annual Assessment Payments Lagging

2008 Annual Assessments from 19 homeowners are now past due.

WPHA covenants and Board Resolution 6 of May 10, 2002, provide that "the voting rights and right to use of the recreational facilities" are suspended during any period that an assessment is past due.

Additional penalties include interest on past due assessments, property lien and

foreclosure of the lien.


Voting and other suspended rights will be restored on payment of assessments, interest and costs.

Tree Worries?

If you are worried about trees falling on your house during storms, here are some considerations:

- WPHA covenants generally require AC approval before removing trees, but
- Size Matters Only trees having a diameter of 12 inches or more

measured two feet above the ground require AC approval before removal.

 The Architectural Guide gives blanket approval to remove obviously dead trees of any size.

tornadoes occur in Georgia from March through May. April is the peak month, although tornadoes can happen anytime of the year.

WP residents have several ways of receiving severe weather warnings.

Area TV and radio stations broadcast warnings. But you have to be awake and listening to the right station to hear a warning.

There are a couple of "automatic" warning systems available:

Sirens

Cherokee County has a network of warning sirens. These are activated by OEM when a tornado warning has been issued or a tornado sighted.

Siren locations within earshot of WP include:

- Hickory Road at New Light Road
- Toonigh Road east of Ranchwood Trail

Although the sirens can be heard indoors, they are designed to warn people outside. They may not wake you during the night.

These sirens are tested on the first Wednesday of each month.

Weather Alert Radio

Your best bet is one of the Specific Area Message Encoding (SAME) weather alert radios. The SAME fea-

> ture allows you to program codes for specific counties. You don't hear warnings and watches that cover distant areas.

You won't sleep through this alarm when it sounds.

SAME capable radios can be purchased at \$40-70.

Cheaper weather alert radios without the SAME feature are available but you'll soon tire of being waked for warnings that apply to counties south of Atlanta.
